When we look back at the journey that our community has been on over the last two years, it has been significant. The effects of the pandemic are still evident within our economy, creating financial pressure for many of our local friends and neighbours. Despite all of this, one thing has been clear - our community has come together to help us build health and belonging through food. We appreciate all of the support that we receive from our donors. It is your generosity that has allowed us to receive and distribute more 1 million pounds of food in the last year, and continue to deliver wellness programming to help those who need it most.

2021/2022 allowed us to take a look at how we, as an organization, are able to get help to those who need it. When we launched our Mobile Food Market one year ago, we served 60 families each week. Within a year we have been able to serve more than 500 families each week and we recently celebrated the milestone of serving our 18,000th basket. We've had the opportunity to work closely to collaborate with strong community partners to host the Mobile Food Market. Through this, we've seen our host locations become gathering spaces for neighbours, and friendships have flourished.

Alongside providing food security for our community it is important to us to continue to provide health and wellness offerings. We have seen an overall increase in engagement from participants with adults, children, and whole families participating. More significantly, attendees are making substantial progress on multiple levels - including both mental and physical health and developing strong friendships and networks of support.

We are able to transform lives thanks to you, our community, donors, volunteers, and partners. We are grateful that your generosity has allowed us to deliver food, programming, and new initiatives to those who need them. The Cambridge Food Bank would not be where it is today without you. We're thankful to have your ongoing support. Together, we truly are making a difference.

Farm Partners

This past year we've had the pleasure of working closely with a variety of farms. From apples to organic kale, from peppers and eggplants to eggs, here's a close up of two particularly unique and outstanding farms that have joined us on the first year of our Mobile Food Market journey.

Fertile Ground Farm

Located in St. Agatha on the Treaty Lands and Territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit, Fertile Ground Farm is an ecological farm that not only grows food organically, but stewards the land they are on. They take care of the soil, seeds, and pollinators, and participate in farmer-led research that helps strengthen a healthy local food system. A living wage employer, they run a CSA (Community Shared Agriculture) based farm growing for more than 375 members. Believing in food justice, Fertile Ground has a community fund that these members can contribute to and in 2021, not only did they match our \$3,000 purchase of produce from them with an additional \$3,000 worth of produce for the Mobile Food Market, they also donated hundreds of pounds of produce for the Community Pantry. What does that look like? Every 2-3 weeks from midsummer until fall folks were able to have a fresh, organic produce item such as kale, carrots, kohlrabi, beets, and squash.





Whispering Meadows Family Farm

Whispering Meadows specializes in meat and eggs, specifically organic beef, pork, lamb and chicken, with a large focus on meats adhering to halal practices. Having halal certified beef meant being able to provide a great protein source for more of the diverse populations that the Cambridge Food Bank and the Mobile Food Market serve. We were able to make a fantastic connection with them when we ordered the equivalent of a whole cow in the winter of 2021. Whispering Meadows showed incredible generosity by donating an additional 500 lbs of halal ground beef and over 300 dozen organic, free range eggs. It is wonderful to be able to include rich protein sources to those who may not otherwise be able to afford this nutritious food.



Abel Anderson Award

This award is presented annually during the Annual General Meeting of the Cambridge Food Bank. It was established in 2002 as a memorial to Abel Anderson, a young man that died in a tragic accident in 1991. He was fourteen.

Abel's native heritage encouraged him to be the best he could be, despite facing many challenges. Abel's mantra of always doing his personal best was a legacy that he left. When asked what he wanted to do when he grew up, Abel's comment was, "I want to be a good person". For his family and friends, he more than fulfilled that aspiration.

Donor Spotlight



For more than a decade, Gerdau Ameristeel and its employees have been supporting the Cambridge Food Bank in the fight to end hunger. Whether through financial or food donations, Gerdau's support has been invaluable in our efforts to meet the ever-growing need in our community. In 2021 alone, \$11,000 was donated by the company.

Employees are encouraged to get involved in supporting the community in a variety of ways including raffles during the holidays. Proceeds from scrap metal generated from the Gerdau Cambridge Mill location go to a variety of charities, including the Cambridge Food Bank.

This year, the Cambridge location installed raised vegetable gardens on site and have been growing fresh produce for our Youth Wellness programs and distribution in Emergency Food Hampers.

- Gerdau recycles over 14 million tons of scrap per year.

- Co-products created during steel production are used in road paving, railway ballast, foundries, cement manufacturing, and ceramics. Gerdau recycles more than 90% of its co-products.
- Greenhouse gas emissions produced by Gerdau are less than half of the steel industry average.
